

NEW HOPE, GROUNDBREAKING MEDICATION for PATIENTS with MS

ike snowflakes, no two people with multiple sclerosis (MS) are exactly alike.



"It's a disease with variable and unpredictable symptoms," says Mirela Cerghet, M.D., Ph.D., F.A.A.N., a Henry Ford Health System neurologist.

With the condition, the body's immune system mistakenly attacks myelin, the fatty substance that surrounds and insulates nerves, to disrupt how nerve impulses travel from the brain to the spinal cord. Common symptoms include blurred vision, fatigue, numbness or tingling in the arms and legs, and difficulty walking.

But people with relapsing/ remitting MS, which is the most common form of the disease, have one thing in common: They need to take their medication as directed to help prevent relapses — active lesions in the brain's white matter that can show up on an MRI, which indicate that the disease is progressing. "Only 60 to 75% of patients adhere to their medication schedule. We'd like it to be 100%," says Dr. Cerghet.

REVOLUTIONARY TREATMENT

Fortunately, new prescription medications are available to make managing MS easier, including Gilenya, a once-a-day pill that is the first oral medication for treating MS.

Before taking Gilenya, you'll need to be tested for macular edema, an eye condition that



"Gilenya is very effective in reducing the relapse rate, and has been a good alternative for people who don't tolerate or respond to self-injections," says Suzanne Croll, R.N., B.S.N., M.S.C.N., MS Clinical Coordinator for Henry Ford Health System.

can distort vision due to a buildup of fluid in the macula, an area at the center of the retina. You'll also need to be retested for macular edema three months after taking Gilenya and then again yearly.

To monitor this rare side effect, HF Neurology partners with Henry Ford OptimEyes and offers optical coherence tomography (OCT), a noninvasive imaging test that uses light waves to take pictures of the retina. To track other possible side effects, you'll also need frequent blood tests and a yearly dermatology exam. "But most patients tolerate Gilenya well," Dr. Cerghet adds.


Emily Gillette, O.D.





END THE YEAR WITH A COMPREHENSIVE EYE EXAM

dd one last item to your to-do list before the year is through:
Get an eye exam. You especially need an eye exam if diabetes runs in your family or you notice changes in your vision, such as blurriness, trouble focusing, occasional double vision, or flashes or floaters.

BE ON THE LOOKOUT FOR PROBLEMS

Anyone with diabetes is at high risk of developing diabetic retinopathy. "Initially, diabetic retinopathy causes damage to the tiny blood vessels, called capillary vessels, in the retina," says Hua Gao, M.D., a Henry Ford Health System ophthalmologist and retinal specialist.

"These blood vessels are thinner than a hair. Diabetes can cause them to leak, with subsequent hemorrhage and retinal detachment, resulting in blurry vision. In later stages, diabetic retinopathy can lead to vision loss and blindness."

GET AN EYE EXAM

The good news is that you can treat diabetic retinopathy with medication or laser therapy. "An eye exam can diagnose diabetic retinopathy at the earliest possible stage and treat it accordingly," Dr. Gao says.

An eye exam can also detect diabetes in the first place. "Many patients don't know they have it," Dr. Gao says.



DON'T LET DIABETES STEAL YOUR SIGHT

If you have diabetes, it's important to manage your blood sugar and see your eye doctor once a year or as often as your doctor recommends. Please call 1-800-EYE-CARE (1-800-393-2273) or visit henryford.com/eyes to make an appointment for an eye exam today.

Patients at the current Port Huron office: Your medical records will be transferred to the new facility. "We are very excited about the opportunity to better serve our patients' vision and medical eye care needs," Dr. Sebok says.
